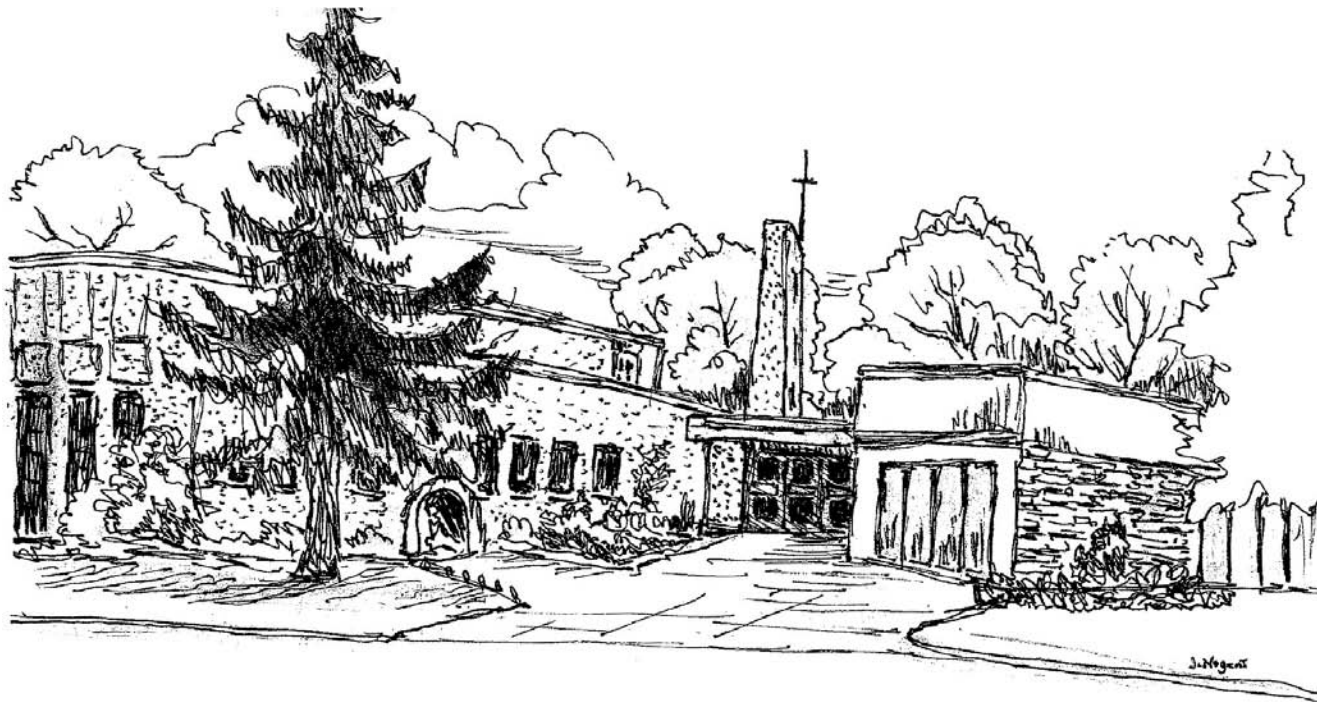

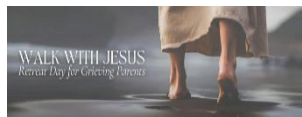

PORKETTA ON A BUN

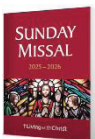

OUR YEAR WITH GOSPEL OF ST. LUKE ends next weekend as we celebrate the feast of Christ the King. You will notice that Luke closes things in a way that feels like a gentle turning back toward everyday life. His gospel is shaped by long journeys, table conversations, and stories that are not rushed. When the liturgical year lands at the end of Luke, the church isn't trying to create a grand finale so much as it is trying to hand people back to their real lives with clearer eyes. We end with Christ's kingship as something startlingly unlike power in any ordinary sense. His "reign" looks like mercy in motion, forgiveness spoken under pressure, and a willingness to keep searching for the people who wander away. Because so many of Luke's scenes are about Christ walking into ordinary human places, dinner tables, dusty roads, the homes of people who are ashamed, the corners where people wait without hope, the close of the year can feel less like a finish and more like a subtle assignment.

One thing that remains after spending so much time with Luke is that God notices us before we get our act together. Stories like Zacchaeus and the tax collector in the temple never flatter the religiously impressive. Luke insists that grace is the spark, not the reward. The year leaves you with the sense that humility and honesty crack the door open wider than moral self-confidence ever does.

A second thing that sticks is Luke's eye for outsiders. His gospel is comfortable naming women as protagonists, Gentiles as clever examples, and sinners as people who don't stay trapped in their reputation forever. Once you've lived with Luke for weeks and weeks, you start developing that instinct yourself: there are people we have half-written off, and Luke pushes you to go back and look again.

A third thread that becomes permanent is joy. Not sentimental excitement, but a joy that can survive grief. The Magnificat, the shepherds in the night, the prodigal father running down the road, Luke keeps threading joy into places that don't deserve it. By the end of the liturgical cycle, it's hard not to notice how much that matters. Joy in Luke is not an accessory. It's fuel.

A fourth lesson is that discipleship is learned while walking. Luke loves the road. Emmaus is the clearest example, Jesus breaking open Scripture not from a podium but while walking beside people who don't understand what has happened. So when the year ends, you're reminded that revelation rarely comes as a single moment. It grows while you move.

And a fifth takeaway is that divine kingship looks like self-giving. Luke's crucifixion is quiet and piercing. The thief who asks to be remembered is promised paradise while everyone else is mocking. That scene becomes the lens through which the church looks at power and service. The end of Luke is not a triumphant victory lap. It's a king saving people one by one, even while dying.

So, when the year closes with Luke, we're not pushed toward lofty ideas. We're nudged toward faces, roads, and conversations. It's about meeting God there again, even in November.
